## RECIPROCITY AGREEMENT

## SOCIÉTÉ MATHÉMATIQUE SUISSE (SMS)

and

## REAL SOCIEDAD MATEMATICA ESPAÑOLA (RSME)

In accordance with all bylaws and regulations governing both Societies (articles 3.6, 9 d) and 23.5 of the RSME and of the SMS), and after consultation and approval of their respective governing bodies, the president of the SMS and the president of the RSME hereby sign this Reciprocity Agreement.

- 1.- The SMS recognize to all members of the RSME in good standing who are residing outside Switzerland, the right to become Reciprocity Members of the SMS. The annual membership fee will be equivalent to 50% of the annual fee charged to SMS members (the rate for Ordinary Members of SMS in 2003 is CHF 50).
- 2. The RMSE recognize to all members of the SMS in good standing who are residing outside Spain, the right to become Reciprocity Members of the RSME. The annual membership fee will be equivalent to 50% of the annual fee charged to RSME members (the rate for Ordinary Members of RSME in 2003 is EUR 42).
- 3.- The reciprocity fee will be invoiced by the Society where one is a reciprocity member.
  - 4.- This option will be announced annually by each Society to all its members.
- 5.- Both societies agree to share all necessary data regarding reciprocity members if problems concerning the membership status arise.
  - 6.- The SMS and the RSME agree:
  - To exchange periodical publications.
  - To exchange invitations for all relevant activities organized by each society.
- To keep frequent contacts aimed to the study and solving of problems associated with teaching and research in mathematics.
  - To organize a joint event.
- $\bullet$  To promote activities for the improvement of the mathematical collaboration between both countries.

7.- This present agreement will lose its validity by lack of fulfillment of its objectives or by simple request of one of the societies, as long as it has the approval of the appropriate governing bodies and be communicated early in advance.

This agreement is signed by the Presidents of both Societies.
